PROTECTING THE NATURAL LANDSCAPE AND OUR OUTDOOR CLASSROOM FOR GENERATIONS TO COME, we partner with Minnesota Conservation Corp, Weed Warriors volunteer group, and Rochester Park and Recreation Department to manage the land. This season, goats joined the team to battle invasive buckthorn! Grazing 10 acres to clear the understory, we will plant 350 trees next spring to restore that land to native habitat.

QUARRY HILL IS A HUB FOR VALUED COMMUNITY PARTNERS like Zumbro Valley Audubon Society, Southeast Minnesota Beekeepers, Minnesota Master Naturalist and Rochester Public Schools. These partners gather here to collaborate, provide education, and lend their expertise to connect our community to nature.



Each summer local students participate in our independent study science course, a collaboration with Rochester Public Schools. Assisting our staff with summer camp programs, these student leaders earn high school science credit during a mentored experience in the field of education and science.
